REBUILDING INITIATIVE IN JACMEL, HAITI - SPONSORSHIP REQUEST

Dear Sponsor,

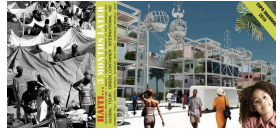
The recent earthquake in Haiti is a disaster of immense proportion that presents the reconstruction efforts with arduous logistical and organizational challenges. GCIA is an international NGO headquartered in the neighboring Dominican Republic and with a team of experts in Haiti, Florida, Mexico, Germany and the U.S. GCIA is providing disaster relief and long term planning in Haiti through the repurposing of donated shipping containers in cooperation with the Chamber of Commerce in Jacmel, Haiti.

1. There are 2 MILLION HOMELESS HAITIANS living IN TENT CAMPS who need emergency shelter...This situation can no longer be tolerated.
2. Experts have been anticipating an HIGHER THAN AVERAGE PROBABILITY for a MAJOR HURRICANE LANDFALL in the Caribbean due to a weakening of the "El Niño" weather phenomenon.

GCIA is responding to the crisis with obtainable and scalable objectives, with your help.

PHASE 1

- Complete Master Plan and site development for 100 Container shelters that will provide housing for 800 homeless people over the next three months in the Jacmel Community.
- Provide the complete electrical Infrastructure to be connected to the layout of the Container Units.
- Provide an eco-friendly potable water and wastewater management system to the layout of the Containers Units.

The repurposing of the shipping containers necessitates the following donations in kind:

- White plastic paint with rolls and brushes (min 25 gallons)
- Plywood board 3/4" for floor use (min 20 sheets 4X8)
- 4 points concrete foundations (min 20)
- Double screen doors and top element at both sides of the container (min 10)
- Aluminum portable camping folding beds (min 40)
- Metal cable standard wire guage #6 for the shading elements (we will use local bamboo on site for the construction) - (min 300 feet)
- Emptied 200 liter grey water metal drum (min 10)
- Geo textile fabric of 9x24 ft for the "Green Roof" (min 5 9X24 ft)
- 5 white tarps 10x10 ft for the pluvial water recollection

In an effort to give caring corporations an opportunity to participate in the rebuilding efforts, we are asking that you become a sponsor of the Rebuilding Initiative in Jacmel.
